Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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	Sec. 1. 39-A MRSA §215, sub-§3 is enacted to read:
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	3. Continued health insurance coverage. In addition to any
6	other benefits required by this Act, if an employee dies as a
	result of a compensable injury, the employer shall continue to
8	provide health insurance coverage to the family of the deceased
	employee, at the employer's expense, for up to 6 months following
10	the employee's death. The employer is not obligated to provide
	<u>or pay for such coverage if:</u>

	A. Family members were not covered by a health insurance
14	policy or plan sponsored by the employer before the
	<pre>employee's death; or</pre>

1.0	B. Family members decline coverage at any time during the 6
18	months following the employee's death. Coverage may be
20	declined only by a letter mailed to the employer and signed
20	by persons entitled to coverage under this subsection.

22	SUMMARY
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	This bill requires an employer to continue to provide health
26	insurance coverage to the family of an employee who dies as a
	result of a workplace injury. The employer is required to pay
28	100% of the cost of the coverage for up to 6 months after the
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employee's death.
