An Act To Preserve Competition in the Long-distance Telephone Market

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §7108 is enacted to read:
§7108. Separation of marketing
A telephone utility that provides both local exchange
service and interstate interexchange service may not market or
refer to its interstate interexchange service offerings when
marketing or arranging local exchange service to a customer. The commission by rule shall establish standards of conduct governing
telephone utilities that provide both local exchange and
interstate interexchange service to ensure that employees
involved in the marketing of local exchange services are not
involved in the marketing of interstate interexchange services.
Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical
rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
SUMMARY
This bill ensures that employees of telephone utilities that
provide both local exchange and interstate interexchange service
who are involved in the marketing of local exchange services are not involved in the marketing of interstate interexchange
services.
