**RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of** Maine To Provide That the State Fund 100 Percent of Education for Students from Kindergarten to Postsecondary School

**Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two thirds of each 2 branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

## Constitution, Art. VIII, Part First, §1 is amended to read:

Section 1. Legislature shall require towns to support 8 public schools; duty of Legislature. A general diffusion of the advantages of education being essential to the preservation of 10 the rights and liberties of the people; to promote this important object, the Legislature are authorized, and it shall be their 12 duty to require, the several towns to make suitable provision,-at their--own--expense, for the support and maintenance of public schools; and it shall further be their duty to encourage and 14 suitably endow, from time to time, as the circumstances of the 16 people may authorize, all academies, colleges and seminaries of learning within the State; provided, that no donation, grant or 18 endowment shall at any time be made by the Legislature to any literary institution now established, or which may hereafter be 20 established, unless, at the time of making such endowment, the Legislature of the State shall have the right to grant any 22 further powers to alter, limit or restrain any of the powers vested in any such literary institution, as shall be judged necessary to promote the best interests thereof. 24

26 **Constitution, Art. VIII, Part First, §1-A** is enacted to read:

- 28 Section 1-A. State to fully fund public education. The Legislature by proper enactment shall ensure full state funding
   30 of public education, from kindergarten to postsecondary school.

; and be it further

34 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to require that the State provide full funding of public education from kindergarten to postsecondary school?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall 48 vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted,
counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as
votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes
are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the
Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town
 and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

SUMMARY

This constitutional resolution requires that the State 20 provide full funding of public education from kindergarten to postsecondary school.
