34	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of

40	Sec. 1. Rulemaking. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services shall adopt rules regarding levels of foster care,

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SUMMARY

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This amendment replaces the resolve. The amendment retains the emergency status of the resolve. The amendment corrects the proposed implementation date for new reimbursement rates. The amendment deletes the provision requiring the Department of Human Services to retain current foster care reimbursement rates in effect until they have been reviewed and approved by the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The amendment adds a provision requiring the department to conduct rulemaking on issues relating to levels of foster care, including assessment of children and reimbursement rates, and to notify the committee of any proposed rules. The amendment specifies that these rules are routine technical rules.
