1. Mirrors required. A person may not operate on a public way a vehicle so constructed, equipped, loaded or used that the operator is prevented from having a constantly free and unobstructed view of the way immediately to the rear, unless there is attached a mirror er-reflecter placed and adjusted to afford the operator a clear, reflected view of the highway to the rear of the vehicle for a distance of at least 200 feet. A vehicle hauling a load must be equipped with rear view mirrors located on each side of the vehicle.

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies that a motor vehicle hauling a load must be equipped with side rear view mirrors.
