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Sec. 7. Funding. Resolved: That the commission may seek and accept other sources of funds to advance its work. Prompt notice of solicitation and acceptance of funds must be sent to the Legislative Council. All funds accepted are administered through the Area Health Education Center at the University of New England. An accounting record that includes the amount of

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funds, the date the funds were received, from whom the funds were received and the purpose and any limitation on the use of the funds must be forwarded to the Executive Director of Legislative Council. A portion of these funds must transferred to the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council to satisfy the requirements of section 8 of this resolve. If sufficient outside funding has not been received by August 15, 2004 to fully fund all costs of the commission, meetings are not authorized and expenses may not be incurred or reimbursed. Contributions to support the work of the commission may not be accepted from any party having a pecuniary or other vested interest in the outcome of the matters being studied. Any person, other than a state agency, desiring to make financial or in-kind contribution must certify to Legislative Council that it has no pecuniary or other vested interest in the outcome of the study. The certification must be made in the manner prescribed by the Legislative Council. contributions are subject to approval by the Legislative An accounting record of all funds accepted that includes the amount of funds, the date the funds were received, from whom the funds were received and the purpose of and any limitation on the use of those funds must be forwarded to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. The executive director administers any funds received by the commission for the payment of per diem and expenses for legislative members. executive director shall notify the chairs of the commission when sufficient funding has been received and all appointments have been made pursuant to section 4; and be it further

Sec. 8. Compensation of legislative members. Resolved: legislative members of the commission are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings οf the commission. The compensation administered through the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. Public members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Such compensation must be administered through the Area Health Education Center at the University of New England; and be it further

Sec. 9. Report. Resolved: That, no later than November 1, 2004, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including any suggested legislation to implement its recommendations, for presentation to the First Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature; and be it further

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Sec. 10. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council and the Area Health Education Center at the University of New England, which together may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 11. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Area Health Education Center at the University of New England and a copy to the Office of the the Legislative Council, Executive Director of The commission may not incur expenses that would approval. result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. request from the commission, the Area Health Education Center at the University of New England shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further

Commission to Study the Recruitment, Training and Retention of Physicians for Rural and Medically Underserved Areas of Maine

Initiative: Allocates funds, transferred from the Area Health Education Center at the University of New England, to authorize the per diem and expenditures of the legislative members of the Commission to Study the Recruitment, Training and Retention of Physicians for Rural and Medically Underserved Areas of Maine. The cost reflects the 4 legislative members' attending 4 authorized meetings of the commission. If more than 4 meetings are authorized, additional resources will have to be transferred from the Area Health Education Center at the University of New England and allotted via Financial Order.

Current Costs - Legislative Study

### **Legislative Study**

The projected costs to fund the per diem and expenses of legislative members of the proposed study is estimated to be \$1,680 in fiscal year 2004-05. This legislation proposes to allocate funds transferred from the Maine Area Health Education Center (AHEC) at the University of New England as other special revenue to the Legislature to pay for the above mentioned legislative costs. This legislation further stipulates that if sufficient outside funding has not been received by August 15, 2004 to fully fund all costs of the commission, no meetings are authorized and no expenses of any kind may be incurred or reimbursed.
