## 2 CONCEPT DRAFT **SUMMARY** This resolve is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208. This resolve proposes to create a mechanism to examine the 8 State's long-term care assessment system. A committee formed pursuant to this resolve would include all stakeholders, such as Legislators, consumers, institutional providers and community 10 providers. The Legislators would be appointed by the Speaker of 12 the House and the President of the Senate, and the other members would be appointed by the Governor. The committee would be required to study the overlapping federal and state Medicaid eligibility tools, requirements regarding eligibility to perform 14 assessments and the information provided to those who are 16 considered ineligible for long-term care. 18 The commission would be required to report to the Second 20 Regular Session of the 121st Legislature legislation that forces the current assessment system to be more efficient. 22
