COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 461, L.D. 631, Bill, "An Act Concerning the Status of the Maine County Commissioners' Association and the Maine Sheriffs' Association as County Advisory Organizations"

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "§909." in the first paragraph in the 7th line (page 1, line 13 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Secretary" and inserting in its place the following: 'Treasurer'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 1 and before the summary the following:

'Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §5722, sub-§9, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2 and Pt. C, §106 and amended by PL 1989, c. 6, c. 9, §2 and c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

9. Advisory organizations. Obtain the services of municipal advisory organizations. The Legislature recognizes the Maine Municipal Association as a nonprofit advisory organization and declares it to be an instrumentality of its member municipal and quasi-municipal corporations with its assets upon its dissolution to be delivered to the Secretary Treasurer of State to be held in custody for the municipalities of the State. A municipal advisory organization may receive federal grants or contributions for its activities with respect to the solution of local problems; and

Sec. 3. 30-A MRSA §5724, sub-§9, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2 and Pt. C, §106 and amended by PL 1989, c. 6, c. 9, §2 and c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

9. Advisory organizations. Obtain the services of educational advisory organizations. The Legislature recognizes

2 the Maine School Management Association and the Maine School
3 Boards Association as nonprofit advisory organizations and
4 declares these associations to be instrumentalities of their
5 member school administrative units, municipal and quasi-municipal
6 corporations with their assets upon their dissolution to be
7 delivered to the Secretary Treasurer of State to be held in
8 custody for the municipalities of the State. An educational
9 advisory organization may receive federal grants or contributions
10 for their activities with respect to the solution of local
11 problems.

12 A municipality may provide health or remedial services to
13 nonpublic school pupils as authorized by this section only if
14 those services are available to pupils attending the public
15 school serving the municipality.

16 Health and remedial services and instructional materials and
17 equipment provided for the benefit of nonpublic school pupils
18 under this section and the admission of pupils to the nonpublic
19 schools must be provided without distinction as to race, creed,
20 color, the national origin of the pupils or of their teachers.
21 No instructional materials or instructional equipment may be
22 loaned to pupils in nonpublic schools or their parents unless
23 similar instructional material or instructional equipment is
24 available for pupils in a public school served by a municipality.'

28 SUMMARY

30 This amendment replaces the Secretary of State with the
31 Treasurer of State as the entity designated to hold the assets
32 upon dissolution of the Maine County Commissioners' Association
33 and the Maine Sheriffs' Association. It also replaces the
34 Secretary of State with the Treasurer of State as the entity
35 designated to hold the assets for the Maine Municipal
36 Association, the Maine School Management Association and the
37 Maine School Boards Association upon their dissolution in the
38 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, sections 5722 and 5724.
