SUMMARY

32 This amendment changes the bill by striking language requiring the Department of Public Safety to provide booster seats to qualified low-income people. The amendment expands the 34 definition of a "federally approved child restraint system" to include lap-belt-only systems and other federally approved 36 devices such as special harnesses and vests. The amendment allows children over 4'7", regardless of age or weight, to use a 38 vehicle's lap and shoulder belt system instead of a booster seat. The amendment also exempts nonprofit, municipal or contracted 40 transportation service providers from the booster seat portion of the law until February 1, 2005. It also requires that written 42 warnings be issued for a violation of the booster seat portion of
