An Act To Repeal the Forest Products Antitrust Exemption

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §1101, as amended by PL 1977, c. 175, §1, is 4 further amended to read:

- 6 §1101. Contracts in restraint of trade

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8 Every contract, combination in the form of trusts or otherwise, or conspiracy, in restraint of trade or commerce in 10 this State is declared to be illegal +-- provided -- that -- no association - or - corporation - organized - for - the - sole - purpose - of 12 marketing--producing--or--trucking--pulpwood--or--saw--logs---the members-of-or-stockholders-in-which-are-actually-ongaged-in-the 14 production-of--such-products-or--selling,-cutting-or--trucking-the same-shall-be-deemed-to-be-a-conspiracy-or-a-combination-or-in 16 restraint-of-trade-or-an-attempt-to-lessen-competition-or-to-fix prices -- arbitrarily; -- nor -- shall -- the -- marketing -- contracts -- and 18 agreements -- between -- such -- association -- or -- corporation -- and -- its members-or-stockholders-be-considered-illegal-as-such-or-in 20 unlawful--restraint--of--trade--or--as--part--of--a--conspiracy--or eembination-to-accomplish-an -improper -or -illegal-purpose. Whoever 22 shall-make makes any such contract or engage engages in any such combination or conspiracy shall-be is guilty of a Class C crime.

Sec. 2. 13 MRSA §171, as amended by PL 1973, c. 489, §2, is 26 further amended to read:

28 §171. Formation of trusts forbidden

30 It shall--be is unlawful for any firm or incorporated company, or any number of firms or incorporated companies, or any 32 unincorporated company or association of persons or stockholders, organized for the purpose of manufacturing, producing, refining or mining any article or product which that enters into general 34 use and consumption by the people, to form or organize any trust to enter into any combination of firms, incorporated or 36 or unincorporated companies or association of stockholders, or to 38 delegate to any one or more board or boards of trustees or directors the power to conduct and direct the business of the whole number of firms, corporations, companies or associations 40 which-may that have formed or which-may that propose to form a trust, combination or association inconsistent with this section 42 and contrary to public policy. No association or corporation organized for the sole purpose of marketing fish, shellfish or 44 any of the fish products or agricultural products of this State, or for--the-sole--purpose--of--marketing--producing-or--trucking, 46 pulpwood-or-saw-logs, the members of or stockholders in which are actually engaged in the production of such products, or in the 48 selling, canning or otherwise preserving of fish products, or selling,-cutting-or-trucking-of-pulpwood-or-saw-logs,-shall may 50

be deemed to be a conspiracy or a combination or in restraint of trade or an attempt to lessen competition or to fix prices arbitrarily; nor shall may the marketing contracts and agreements between such association or corporation and its members or stockholders be considered illegal as such or in unlawful restraint of trade or as part of a conspiracy or combination to accomplish an improper or illegal purpose.

SUMMARY

12 Under current law contracts and trusts formed for the sole purpose of manufacturing, producing, refining or mining a product 14 may constitute an illegal restraint of trade or conspiracy. Current law exempts from these provisions associations organized 16 for the sole purpose of marketing, producing or trucking pulpwood or saw logs. This bill repeals those provisions.

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
