An Act To Allow Home Schooled Athletes To Play on Private School Teams

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §5026 is enacted to read:

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## §5026. Participation in private school activities by students enrolled in equivalent instruction programs

- 1. Cocurricular and extracurricular activities. A student enrolled in an equivalent instruction program approved by the commissioner pursuant to section 5001-A, subsection 3, paragraph A, subparagraph (3) may participate in an interscholastic, cocurricular or extracurricular activity with a private school. A student enrolled in a private school may participate in an interscholastic, cocurricular or extracurricular activity with another private school if the student's school does not offer the activity.
  - 2. Interscholastic organizations. An organization that governs or organizes an interscholastic, cocurricular or extracurricular activity in the State and includes a public school as a member may not deny a student or that student's team or school eligibility to participate in the activity because the student is enrolled in an equivalent instruction program approved by the commissioner pursuant to section 5001-A, subsection 3, paragraph A, subparagraph (3) and participating in the activity pursuant to subsection 1. A public school may not join or belong to an organization that violates the provisions of this subsection.

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#### **SUMMARY**

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This bill allows a home schooled student to participate in an interscholastic, cocurricular or extracurricular activity at a private school and a student enrolled in a private school to participate interscholastic, cocurricular in an extracurricular activity another private school if at student's school does not provide the activity. This bill also forbids interscholastic organizations to deny the eligibility of a student or that student's team or school in an interscholastic, cocurricular or extracurricular activity because the student is home schooled but participating with a private school and forbids schools from belonging to such interscholastic public organizations.
