24	lines 7 to 10 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:
26	'Except as otherwise provided in federal or state law, a
28	person, corporation or other entity may not deny goods or services to an individual because the individual refuses to provide a social security number. This section does not apply to
30	a financial institution as defined in Title 9-B, section 131.

34	SUMMARY
36	This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development. The
38	amendment clarifies that social security numbers may be required for certain transactions under current federal or state law and
40	exempts financial institutions from the bill's prohibition.
