# An Act To Establish a System of Self-governance for Unorganized Areas

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#### §7602. Municipal authority and organization

A town established under this chapter may organize and conduct its affairs in the same manner as other towns organized and operating under general law. The powers and duties of the town are identical to those of other towns under general law. Upon incorporation, registered voters of the town shall vote to name the town, to elect municipal officers and to establish a seat of government for the town.

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#### <u>§7603. Municipal services</u>

The county commissioners of a town established under this 14 chapter shall develop a plan to phase out the provision of municipal services to the residents of the previously unorganized 16 areas as authorized under section 7501, except that a town may choose to contract with the county commissioners of the county in 18 which the town is located to continue to provide municipal services to some or all of the previously unorganized areas that 20 constitute the town. The contracting authority must be granted by the registered voters of the town to the municipal officers at 22 annual meetings.

## 24 §7604. Taxation and revenue

## 26 The municipal officers of a town established under this chapter have the authority to raise and collect all taxes 28 necessary for the operation of the town and its schools. Municipal officials have the authority to allocate and expend all 30 municipal tax revenue raised and collected in the town for the operation of the town's government and schools.

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## §7605. Disposition of unorganized territory funds, contingency and reserve accounts

36 The county commissioners of the county in which a town established under this chapter is located shall transfer to the 38 town, once the town is incorporated, the balance of funds in the county's unorganized territory fund established under section 40 7502. Upon transfer of the funds into the town's general operating account, the town may expend the funds for any services 42 authorized by the town in any area of the town. The transferred funds may also be used to reduce the amount to be collected in 44 taxes in the same town during any budget year.

#### <u>§7606. Education</u>

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Consistent with Title 20-A, each town established under this chapter has the authority to determine educational policy for the previously unorganized areas constituting the town, including operation of its own school or schools or contracting for school services with other school administrative units, the county or the State. The town may establish an elected school committee composed of representatives from each of the previously unorganized areas in the town to set out educational policy and to propose and oversee the town's school budget.

- <u>§7607. Planning and land use</u>
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A town organized under this chapter must establish its own 20 growth management program consistent with chapter 187. After a 22 town has been established for 3 years, the town's growth 22 management program will take effect and its land use regulation 24 Regulation Commission.

#### 26 §7608. Sovereignty of Native Americans

28 This chapter does not affect the sovereign rights of Native Americans over land that they own in a formerly unorganized area 30 that is established as a single town in a county.

 Sec. 2. Reimbursement for tree growth. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Maine Revenue Services
shall develop rules to establish a fair system of reimbursement for tree growth to towns established under the Maine Revised
Statutes, Title 30-A chapter 307. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill establishes a new chapter in the Maine Revised 44 Statutes, Title 30-A that provides a method for unorganized areas 46 to develop a system of self-governance. The bill delineates the 46 requirements that must be met for a town to be created in the 48 unorganized areas. It also outlines the powers, duties and 48 responsibilities of the new town's government. It also requires 49 the Department of Administrative Services, Maine Revenue Services to develop a fair system of reimbursement for tree growth to 2 towns established under this chapter.

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
