This bill provides for an ongoing "maximum loss" provision for the general purpose aid for local schools program. The bill requires that, beginning in fiscal year 2003-04 and for each fiscal year thereafter, the Legislature provide each school administrative unit with at least 90% of the state share of subsidy that it received for the preceding fiscal year for operating costs, program costs excluding the state share of bus purchases and minimum subsidy.
