	6-B. Fiscal impact of direct initiative referenda.
30	Whenever a direct initiative of legislation is presented to the voters of the State pursuant to the Constitution of Maine,
32	Article IV, Part Third, Section 18, the question presented to the
34	voters must be accompanied on the ballot by a statement of the estimated fiscal impact of the proposed legislation on state revenues, appropriations and allocations. The Office of Fiscal
36	and Program Review shall prepare the fiscal statement. The validity of the direct initiative legislation and of the voters'
38	ratification of that legislation is not affected by any errors in the fiscal impact estimate. If the actual fiscal impact varies
40	from such an estimate, the ratification by the voters is nevertheless conclusive, and the validity of the legislation is

The amendment amends the provision of the bill regarding the preparation of the fiscal statement by directing the Office of Fiscal and Program Review to prepare it. The amendment also adds a provision specifying that the validity of the direct initiative legislation is not affected by the validity of the fiscal estimate.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The requirement that ballots for an initiative referenda contain a fiscal impact statement may increase the General Fund costs to the Department of the Secretary of State by increasing the length of the ballots. The Secretary of State's budget includes sufficient funds to accommodate one ballot of average length for the general election in November. If the size of the referendum questions increases the ballot length, an additional appropriation of \$8,000 or more may be required. The amounts will depend on the number of initiative referenda and the length of the fiscal impact statement.
