2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2115 is enacted to read:
4	§2115. Cellular telephone use by juvenile prohibited

8	1. Prohibition. A person who has not attained 18 years of
10	age who has been issued an instruction permit under section 1304 may not operate a motor vehicle while using a handheld cellular
10	telephone.

	2. Penalty. A person who violates this section commits a
14	traffic infraction for which a fine of not less than \$50 for the
	first violation and not less than \$250 for a 2nd or subsequent
16	violation committed within one year of the first violation may be adjudged.

20	SUMMARY
22	This bill prohibits a juvenile less than 18 years of age who is driving under an instruction permit from using a handheld
24	cellular telephone while operating a motor vehicle. The bill makes the offense a traffic infraction.
