COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 642, L.D. 865, "Resolve, Directing the Family Law Advisory Commission To Study and Report on Legal Issues Surrounding Surrogate Parenting and Gestational Agreements"

Amend the resolve by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'Resolve, Directing the Family Law Advisory Commission To Study and Report on the Uniform Parentage Act and Similar Laws and Proposals'

Further amend the resolve by striking out all of the first **Whereas** paragraph (page 1, lines 1 to 3 in L.D.)

Further amend the resolve in the 4th **Whereas** paragraph in the 2nd line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "born as a result of such nontraditional means" and inserting in its place the following: 'in such nontraditional circumstances'

Further amend the resolve in the last **Whereas** paragraph in the last line (page 1, line 22 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "means" the following: 'and when parentage is questioned'

Further amend the resolve by striking out all of section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

'Sec. 1. Study. Resolved: That the Family Law Advisory Commission established under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 52-A is directed to conduct a comprehensive study of the Uniform Parentage Act and similar laws and proposals; and be it further'

SUMMARY

This amendment broadens the study charge to the Family Law Advisory Commission to include the Uniform Parentage Act and related laws and proposals.
