(1) Applies to all persons, active or retired, but, for those already retired, the effective date of any adjustment shall may not be not earlier than the date on which the time or credit is certified to the retirement system; and

(2) Does not apply to any member who begins membership on or after January 1, 1976.

A member who fails to meet one or more of the terms and I. conditions required under paragraphs A, and D and--E may 14 purchase service credit as provided in this paragraph. SUMMARY

Public Law 2001, chapter 114 enacted an exception to the law 38 to allow members of the Maine State Retirement System who didn't have the necessary service during a "federally recognized period 40 of conflict" to buy back service credit for service in the United States Armed Forces by paying the actuarial cost of the portion 42 of the retirement benefit based on the additional creditable This bill instead merely removes the requirement that service. 44 members seeking to buy back service credit for service in the United States Armed Forces have served in a federally recognized 46 period of conflict to be eligible to purchase military service credit.
