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SUMMARY

30 This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. It replaces the bill and retains only 32 that portion of the bill that requires the Legislature and all state agencies to review the laws of the State and the rules 34 agencies administer to identify laws and rules that devalue property. By March 1, 2004, the Legislature must notify all 36 property owners in the State of the laws and rules that have been identified as resulting in the devaluation of property.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The estimated cost for each of the joint standing committees to meet an average of four to five times to conduct the review required by this bill is \$124,321. The Legislature has budgeted \$110,500 in fiscal year 2003-04 for four meetings for all committees to conduct authorized interim work. If more than the budgeted number of meetings are required, the Legislature may require additional General Fund appropriations. The Legislature would also be required to notify all property owners of the laws and rules that have been identified as resulting in the devaluation of property. This notification will result in printing and mailing costs to property owners throughout the state. Assuming there are approximately 500,000 property owners, the printing and mailing costs for a standard mailing would be a minimum of \$250,000. The Legislature will require an additional General Fund appropriation of \$250,000 to cover these costs.
