	Language Interpreters, referred to in this resolve as "the

16	effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all

36	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis
38	shall provide necessary staffing services to the committee; and be it further
40	Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members
42	of the committee are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and
44	reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the committee. Public

C. One member representing an interpreter referral agency;

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members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the committee; and be it further

- Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the committee shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 121st Legislature no later than December 10, 2003. The committee is not authorized to introduce legislation; and be it further
- Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the committee requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Committee budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the committee, with assistance from the committee staff, shall administer the committee's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the committee shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The committee may not incur expenses that would result in the committee's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the committee, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the executive director's designee shall promptly provide the committee chairs and staff with a status report on the committee budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

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This resolve establishes the Committee to Investigate the 36 Feasibility of and Need for Regulation of Spoken Language Interpreters.
