44 SUMMARY

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This bill repeals the Salmon Aquaculture Monitoring, Research and Development Fund, including the 1¢ per pound fee on whole fish harvested paid by the salmon aquaculture industry, and requires the commission to refund any remaining balance in the fund to persons who have paid money into the fund since January

- 1, 2001. Additionally, the bill repeals the authority language for the Maine Salmon Aquaculture Advisory Council, whose purpose was to provide guidance on expenditures from the Salmon Aquaculture Monitoring, Research and Development Fund.
