SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 699, L.D. 942, Bill, "An Act To Create Guidelines To Promote Good Science in Rulemaking"


Amend the amendment in section 1 in subsection 5 in the first paragraph in the 2nd line from the end (page 1, line 46 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "information" the following: ', as determined by the agency,'

Further amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 3-A in the 6th line (page 2, line 45 in amendment) by striking out the following: "20" and inserting in its place the following: '10'

Further amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 3-A in the 8th line (page 2, line 47 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "information" the following: ', as determined by the agency,'

SUMMARY

This amendment decreases from 20 days to 10 days the time by which an agency must provide a list of the primary sources of information relied on by the agency in establishing the primary provisions of a proposed rule. This amendment also clarifies that the primary sources of information required to be provided by the agency are determined by the agency.
