An Act To Require the Chief Medical Examiner To Perform Tests When Public Safety or Health Care Personnel Are Exposed

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3036 is enacted to read:
§3036. Exposure to body fluids
If a public safety or health care employee experiences an
occupational exposure to a body fluid of a deceased person, the
Chief Medical Examiner shall ensure that the deceased person is
tested for blood-borne pathogens as defined in section 831,
subsection 2.
SUMMARY
This bill requires the Chief Medical Examiner to test the body fluids of a deceased person for blood-borne pathogens if a
public safety or health care worker experiences an occupational exposure to the deceased person's body fluids.

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
