Resolve, To Establish the Commission To Study the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's Fish Stocking Procedures and Management and the Enforcement of Fishing Laws in Northwestern Aroostook County

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission 2 to Study the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's Fish Stocking Procedures and Management and the Enforcement of Fishing Laws in Northwestern Aroostook County, referred to in this 4 resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further 6 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 8 consists of 11 members appointed as follows: 10 1. One member of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate: 12 2. One member of the House of Representatives, appointed by 14 the Speaker of the House; The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or the 16 3. commissioner's designee; 18 4. One representative of the Sportsman's Alliance of Maine, 20 appointed by the Speaker of the House; 22 5. One biologist from either the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or the University of Maine, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon recommendation of the Commissioner 24 of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; and 26 Six members of the public, appointed by the Speaker of 6. the House of Representatives, one from each of the following 2.8 Allagash, St. Francis, St. John, Fort Kent, Wallagrass towns: 30 and Eagle Lake; and be it further Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the Senate member is the 32 Senate chair of the commission and the House of Representatives 34 member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: 36 That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall 38 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all 40 appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further 42 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine 44 the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's fish stocking procedures and related management and the enforcement of laws 46 pertaining to fishing in northwestern Aroostook County; and be it 48 further

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Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

6 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission are not entitled to compensation for their attendance 8 at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

10 Sec. 8. Meetings. Resolved: That the commission may hold as many meetings as necessary to conduct its work. At least 3 of the meetings must be held in northwestern Aroostook County and must be open to the public; and be it further

Sec. 9. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 5, 2003, the commission shall submit a report that includes its 16 findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland 18 Fisheries and Wildlife and the Legislative Council. The commission is not authorized to introduce legislation. Following 20 receipt and review of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife may report out a bill to the Second 22 Regular Session of the 121st Legislature; and be it further 24

Sec. 10. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 11. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the 30 commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its 32 first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. 34 The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from 36 the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a 38 status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds. 40

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SUMMARY

This resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's Fish Stocking Procedures and Management and the Enforcement of Fishing Laws in Northwestern Aroostook County.
