8 VIOLATION OF INTERSTATE COMPACT

10 §1347. Violation of interstate compact for adult offender
 supervision

12 A person is guilty of a Class D crime if that person, after
14 being convicted of a crime and sentenced in a state that is a
 member of an interstate compact for adult offender supervision
16 and subsequently released on probation or parole, resides in this
 State without complying with the requirements of the interstate
 compact as enacted by the sentencing state.

22 This bill makes it a Class D crime for a person released on
24 probation or parole by a state that is a member of an interstate
 compact for adult offender supervision to reside in Maine without
 complying with the requirements of that compact.
