8 This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208.

10 Currently, public high school students labeled as "gifted
12 and talented" are enrolled in the honors classes and advanced
14 placement classes offered by their high schools. This bill
16 proposes to clarify that the existing honors and advanced
placement curricula serve to meet curriculum requirements for
educating gifted and talented students, thus obviating the need
for high schools to create an additional separate curriculum for
such students.
