2 4	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §521, sub-§1, ¶E, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 482, Pt. A, §4, is amended to read:
6	E. Has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as Class 3
8	or Class 4 according to standards set by the American Heart Association; ΘF
10 12	Sec. 2. 29-A MRSA §521, sub-§1, ¶F, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 482, Pt. A, §4, is amended to read:
14	F. Is severely limited in the ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition .; or
16 18	Sec. 3. 29-A MRSA §521, sub-§1, ¶G is enacted to read:
20	G. Is recovering from childbirth.
22	Sec. 4. 29-A MRSA §521, sub-§6, ¶A, as amended by PL 2001, c. 35, §3, is further amended to read:
24	A. An application for a temporary placard must be
26	accompanied by the certificate of a physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner attesting to the applicant's physical disability as defined in subsection 1 and the
28	period of time that the physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner determines the applicant will have the
30	disability. A temporary placard is not valid for a period of more than 6 months. The Secretary of State must give
32	priority consideration to requests for temporary placards.
34	A temporary placard issued pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph G is valid, after the birth of a child, for a
36	<u>period of not more than:</u>
38	(1) Three days in winter for natural child birth;
40	(2) One week for a cesarean delivery; or
42	(3) A time to be determined by the patient's physician for a premature birth.

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48	D. The Secretary of State shall provide hospitals with information to be given to maternity patients, explaining
50	the availability and procedure by which a temporary disability placard may be obtained.

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4	SUMMARY
	This bill authorizes the Secretary of State to issue
6	temporary disability placards to women who are recovering from
	childbirth. The bill requires the Secretary of State to supply
8	hospitals with information about the temporary disability
	placards so that the hospitals can distribute the information to
10	women who have given birth.

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
