Resolve, To Establish the Task Force to Study the Feasibility of Adding an Interchange for Access to the Lakes Region Area

Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, this resolve establishes the Task Force to Study the Feasibility of Adding an Interchange for Access to the Lakes Region Area; and

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Whereas, this resolve is necessary as an emergency measure to afford time for the issues to be appropriately addressed by the task force; and

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Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 20 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 22 safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to Study the Feasibility of Adding an Interchange for Access to the Lakes Region Area, referred to in this resolve as "the task force," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force 30 consists of 21 members appointed as follows:

32 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;

2. Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed 36 by the Speaker of the House;

38 3. One representative of the Maine Turnpike Authority, appointed by the President of the Senate upon recommendation of
 40 the Executive Director of the Maine Turnpike Authority;

42 4. One representative of the Route 302 and You Committee, appointed by the President of the Senate;

5. One representative of each of the following 46 organizations, appointed by the President of the Senate: Windham Chamber of Commerce; Auburn Chamber of Commerce; Gray Chamber of 48 Commerce; and the Greater Bridgton Lakes Region Chamber of Commerce;

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- One representative of the Department of Transportation,
 appointed by the Speaker of the House upon recommendation of the Commissioner of Transportation;
- One representative of the Department of Transportation,
 Bureau of Planning, Regional Transportation Advisory Committee, appointed by the Speaker of the House upon recommendation of the
 Commissioner of Transportation; and
- 8. One representative of each of the following towns, appointed by the Speaker of the House: Naples, Casco, Poland,
 Auburn, Gray, Raymond, Windham and Westbrook; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair of the task force and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the task force; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of task force. Resolved: That all
 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall
 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after
 appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force; and be it further
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Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall study the traffic flow along Route 302 and examine the feasibility of creating an additional interchange from the Maine Turnpike for access to the lakes region area. The task force shall also consider the location for the interchange and may include other issues relevant to the study; and be it further

- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis
 shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the task force are entitled to the legislative per diem, as 40 defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and 42 reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or 44 other entities that they represent are entitled to receive 46 reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem 48 for their attendance at authorized meetings of the task force; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 31, 2 2003, the task force shall submit a report that includes its 4 findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, Standing for presentation to the Joint Committee on Transportation and the Legislative Council. The task force is 6 not authorized to introduce legislation. Following receipt and 8 review of the report, the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation may report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 121st Legislature; and be it further 10

12 Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the task force requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its 14 report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Task force budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall 18 administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and 20 proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task 22 force's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council 24 shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a status report on the task force's budget, expenditures incurred 26 and paid and available funds.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 30 preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

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This resolve establishes the Task Force to Study the 36 Feasibility of Adding an Interchange for Access to the Lakes Region Area.
