sufficient quality to support all species of fish indigenous to the receiving waters and maintain the structure and function of the resident biological community; and

Whereas, the fact that water storage reservoirs are not 6 natural lakes should be recognized when implementing water quality classifications; and

Whereas, many water storage reservoirs were authorized by legislative charter for the purpose of storing and releasing water for in-stream purposes and downstream uses; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Water storage reservoirs; rules. Resolved: 14 That the Department of Environmental Protection, Board of Environmental Protection shall adopt rules under the Maine Revised Statutes, 16 Title 38, section 464, subsection 5 relating to protocols and procedures for evaluation of the resident biological community in 18 water storage reservoirs. In adopting the rules, the Board of Environmental Protection shall recognize that water storage 20 reservoirs are artificial and are not natural water bodies, and 22 the rules must ensure that the existing uses of water storage reservoirs are maintained and protected. In issuing licenses, permits and certifications prior to final adoption of the rules, 24 the Department of Environmental Protection shall recognize that water storage reservoirs are artificial and are not natural water 26 bodies and shall ensure that the existing uses of water storage 28 reservoirs are maintained and protected. The goal of the rules and any license, permit or certification must be to require that 30 the structure and function of the resident biological community that must be maintained in a water storage reservoir is the structure and function that would be expected to exist in a water 32 storage reservoir with a drawdown of similar magnitude. As used in this resolve, "water storage reservoir" means an impoundment 34 associated with a hydropower project, as defined by Title 38, section 632, that was in existence prior to November 28, 1975, 36 was not primarily lacustrine in its natural state, is classified under Title 38, section 465-A and is managed to store and release 38 water on an annual cycle to benefit downstream hydropower 40 generation.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment requires the Department of Environmental Protection, Board of Environmental Protection, when adopting rules relating to protocols and procedures for evaluation of the resident biological community in water storage reservoirs, to recognize that water storage reservoirs are artificial and are not natural

water bodies and to recognize and protect existing uses. The amendment also requires the Department of Environmental 2 Protection, when issuing licenses, permits and certifications 4 prior to final adoption of the rules, to recognize that water storage reservoirs are artificial and are not natural water 6 bodies and to ensure that the existing uses of water storage reservoirs are maintained and protected. The amendment provides that the goal of the rules or any license, permit or 8 certification must be that the structure and function of the 10 resident biological community that must be maintained in a water storage reservoir is the structure and function that would be 12 expected to exist in a water storage reservoir with a drawdown of similar magnitude. The amendment also defines "water storage 14 reservoir."
