SUMMARY

This is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee 18 The amendment replaces the bill. on Transportation. The amendment requires law enforcement agencies to report motor 20 vehicle pursuit statistics to the State Police traffic division on a quarterly basis. The amendment further requires the Chief of the State Police to develop and furnish a format for 22 standardized reporting by agencies and clarifies that the 24 information contained in the report is for statistical purposes only and can not be used for civil or criminal proceedings. 26
