An Act To Prohibit the Use of Imitation High-intensity Discharge Bulbs

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1904, sub-§5, ¶G is enacted to read:

G. A replacement bulb or other lighting device intended to replace a headlight must conform with and be installed according to the federal motor vehicle safety standards established in 49 Code of Federal Regulations, 571.108 (2002) for original-equipment headlights. The use of high-intensity discharge bulbs is permitted, but only to the extent that the bulbs are installed in conformity with this paragraph. The operator of a vehicle in noncompliance with this paragraph is considered in violation of the inspection

standards set forth in section 1756.

This bill requires replacement bulbs or headlights on motor vehicles to conform with and be installed according to federal motor vehicle safety standards. The use of high-intensity discharge bulbs is permitted, but only if the lights are installed correctly.
