Resolve, To Establish the Study Committee to Study the Feasibility of a 4-year High School Vocational Program

Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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6 Feasibility of a 4-year High School Vocational Program; and

8 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a 10 report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Study Commission to Study the Feasibility of a 4-year High School Vocational Program, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further

- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 10 members appointed as follows:
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1. Three members appointed by the President of the Senate 28 as follows:

- 30 A. One member of the Senate who is a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs;
- B. One member who is a current vocational technical high 34 school administrator; and
- 36 C. One member who is on the State Board of Education;
- 38 2. Three members appointed by the Speaker of the House as follows:
- A. One member of the House of Representatives who is a
 member of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs;

B. One member who is a current vocational technical high school administrator; and

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C. One member who is on the State Board of Education; and

- 2 3. Four members appointed by the Governor as follows:
- 4 A. One member who attends a vocational college;
- 6 B. One member who is on a local board of education in a Maine community;
- C. One member who is an officer of the Maine Education 10 Association; and
- 12 D. One member who is a member of a trade union; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further
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Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine the feasibility of establishing a 4-year high school vocational program to provide a technical high school setting for middle school students to attend at the completion of the 8th grade; and be it further

32 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the 34 Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and 36 be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members 38 of the commission are entitled to the legislative per diem, as 40 defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. 42 Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or 44 other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of 46 financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; 48 and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 1, 2 2003, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 121st 4 Legislature. The commission is authorized to introduce legislation related to its report to the Second Regular Session б of the 121st Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further 8

Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. The commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall 16 administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its 18 first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The 20 commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from 22 the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and 24 paid and available funds.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

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SUMMARY

This resolve establishes a study commission to study the 34 feasibility of providing a technical high school setting for middle school students to attend after they complete 8th grade.
