	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §7053-A is enacted to read:
6	§7053-A. State workers hired through long-term contracts or grants
8	1. State policy. The policy of the State to permit all state employees to participate to the fullest extent possible in
10	the benefits of the civil service system must be extended to state workers hired through long-term contracts and long-term
12	grants.
14	2. Rules. The director shall adopt rules by July 1, 2004 to implement the policy under subsection 1 for workers hired
16	through long-term contracts and long-term grants. Rules adopted pursuant to this chapter are routine technical rules as defined
18	in chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. At a minimum, the rules must:
20	A. Define "long-term contract" and "long-term grant"; and
22	B. Provide that a person who has been hired through a long-term contract or long-term grant is eligible:
24	(1) To accrue and use vacation and sick leave;
26	(2) To receive holiday pay;
30	(3) For salary increases, training opportunities and other benefits available to state employees;
32	(4) To participate in the retirement program for state employees; and
34	(5) To participate in health and hospitalization

42	This bill extends to workers hired by the State through long-term contracts or long-term grants the same benefits as all other state employees.
