Be it enac	ted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

36	This bill redefines "muzzle-loading firearm" by providing
, 38	clear definitions of a basic muzzleloader, a primitive muzzleloader and a traditional muzzleloader. The bill strikes
40	out language that limits the authority of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to extend the muzzle-loading open
42	season on deer for more than 12 days in any part of the State. The bill authorizes the commissioner to establish different
44	seasons for the 3 types of muzzleloaders.
