2	Intergovernmental Advisory Commission, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further
4	Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission
6	consists of 21 members appointed as follows:
8	1. Seven members from State Government, 5 of whom must be commissioners appointed by the Governor and 2 of whom must be
10	Legislators, one Senator appointed by the President of the Senate and one Representative appointed by the Speaker of the House;
12	2. Seven county officials recommended by the Maine County
14	Commissioners Association to be appointed by the Governor; and
16	3. Seven municipal officers recommended by the Maine Municipal Association to be appointed by the Governor; and be it

20	Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the 2 legislative members of the commission are the cochairs; and be it further
22	Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That
24	all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall
26	notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after
28	appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further
30	Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the

6. Implement the other reforms proposed by the Task Force on Intergovernmental Structure, in its November 1997 Final Report, including, but not limited to, the creation of a county revenue sharing program and assistance to counties to undertake reforms of their charters and their provision of municipal services; and

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- 7. Recommend further reforms as its findings dictate; and be it further
  - Staff assistance. Resolved: Sec. 6. That, the Executive Office, Department, State Planning the Maine Municipal Association and the Maine County Commissioners Association shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission out of existing resources and shall contribute funds equally to pay for any agreed upon expenses; and be it further
  - Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further
    - Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than January 15, 2004, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 121st Legislature; and be it further
    - Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further
    - Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a

status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

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## **SUMMARY**

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This resolve establishes the Intergovernmental Advisory Commission to study ways to reduce duplication among all 3 levels of government in the State as well as within each level of government; promote communications, cooperation and efficient delivery of services; and develop a mechanism to establish a permanent statewide intergovernmental advisory commission.
