All participants in the working group serve without compensation. No later than January 15, 2004, the commissioner shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry with a summary of the working group's discussion and recommendations; and be it further

26 Sec. 2. Authority to report out legislation. Resolved: That the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and 28 Forestry may report out legislation to the Second Regular Session 29 of the 121st Legislature regarding measures to ensure the 30 integrity of genetically engineered and nongenetically engineered 30 crops.'

## **SUMMARY**

36 This amendment replaces the bill. It directs the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to convene 38 a working group to develop an approach for and discuss the potential of a marketing initiative to promote Maine agricultural crops as free of genetically engineered materials. It authorizes 40 the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to report out legislation to the Second Regular Session 42 of the 121st Legislature regarding measures to protect the integrity of genetically engineered and nongenetically engineered 44 crops.
