48	This amendment clarifies that a person who serves as both a selectman and a tax assessor may resign the position of assessor without resigning the office of selectman. It also clarifies

that if a member of the State Legislature resigns the position of assessor, that person may continue to serve in the State Legislature. It also clarifies that a person currently serving in the Legislature or other office deemed to be incompatible with the office of assessor who is later elected as a selectman and assessor has the opportunity to resign the office of assessor prior to performing duties as assessor without being considered to have vacated the legislative office or other incompatible office due to the incompatibility of the offices.
