SUMMARY

12 This bill creates a school voucher program for students who live in households having an annual household income of \$30,000 14 attend public schools that or less and who have а student-to-teacher ratio greater than 20 to 1. If a student who 16 is eligible for a school voucher chooses to leave a public overcrowded school to attend a public, private or religious school that has a student-to-teacher ratio less than 20 to 1, 18 this bill would require the State to pay \$3,000 to that receiving school towards the education of that student. The remainder of 30 the cost to educate that student at the receiving school is paid 22 by the sending school, up to an amount equal to the per-pupil costs at the sending school.
