Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1202, sub-§1-B, as amended by PL 2001, c. 386, §3, is further amended to read:

1-B. Notwithstanding subsection 1, the period of probation for a person convicted of a Class D or Class E crime involving domestic violence must-be is 2 years, except that the term of probation must--be--terminated--at--the--time--the--probationer eempletes-a-certified-batterers'-intervention-program-as-defined in-Title-19-A,-section-4014, unless there-is another-condition-of probation-that-has-yet-to-be-met terminates when the probationer has served at least one year of probation, has completed a certified batterers' intervention program as defined in Title 19-A, section 4014 and has met all other conditions of probation.

SUMMARY

This bill specifies that the period of probation for a person convicted of a Class D or Class E crime involving domestic violence is 2 years, except that the term of probation terminates when the probationer has served at least one year, has completed a certified batterers' intervention program and has met all other conditions of probation.
