This bill requires airmobiles and motorboats to pass noise limit tests with cutouts engaged and disengaged and sets a minimum of a \$300 fine for exceeding noise limits. The bill also

- prohibits the discharge of septic fluids into the inland waters of the State.
- This bill exempts those vessels from the noise limits while the vessels are engaged in an organized racing event that is sanctioned by a recognized racing organization and registered with the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.
