HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 963,
L.D. 1309, Bill, "An Act To Protect Public Health by Reducing Human Exposure to Arsenic"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 2.

Further amend the amendment in section 3 in the last indented paragraph in the first to 3rd lines (page 3, lines 8 to 22 10 in amendment) by striking out the following: "has the same 24 meaning as in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1681" and inserting in its place the following: 'means lumber, timber, piles, poles, posts, plywood, shakes, shingles or other wood or 26 forest products intended for outdoor use that have been pressure treated to reduce decay with a wood preservative containing 28 inorganic arsenic or inorganic arsenic compounds, including, but not limited to, chromated copper arsenate, commonly referred to 30 as "CCA," or similar arsenic-based wood-preserving chemical 32 mixtures'

Further amend the amendment in section 6 in the 5th and 6th
 lines (page 3, lines 47 and 48 in amendment) by striking out the
 following: "the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1681"
 and inserting in its place the following: 'section 2 of this Act'

Further amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering 40 any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
