Resolve, To Establish a Commission To Determine Why Young People Are Leaving Maine

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, the commission established in this resolve must initiate its study before the 90-day period expires in order that 6 the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and 8 10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, be it Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission 16 to Determine Why Young People Are Leaving Maine, referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it 18 further 20 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 22 consists of 9 members appointed as follows: youngest female member the House of 24 1. The of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House; 26 A male member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House, who is of a different party from the 28 other legislative member of the House of Representatives and is from a different geographic region from the other legislative 30 members: 32 The youngest member of the Senate, appointed by the 34 President of the Senate: A member of the Senate, appointed by the President of 36 the Senate, who is of a different gender and different party from 38 the other legislative member of the Senate and is from a different geographic region from the other legislative members; 40 Three members of the public who are under 21 years of age, one appointed by the President of the Senate and 2 appointed

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One expert in the field of migration, appointed by the President of the Senate; and

7. One expert on Maine, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and be it further

by the Speaker of the House;

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- Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further
 - Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall examine the following issues to determine why young people are leaving the State and why more young people are not moving to the State: employment opportunities, nightlife, educational opportunities, immigration policies, culture and the history of the State. In conducting the study, the commission shall hold 12 informational sessions in different locations throughout the State for discussions with knowledgeable persons. The commission may also:
 - Conduct, summarize and analyze the results of a literature search;
 - 2. Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of the public or affected persons and groups;
 - 3. Procure and analyze other data;

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- 4. Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal questions within the scope of the study; and
- 5. Determine and summarize the legislative actions or governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related to issues within the scope of the study; and be it further
- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members
 of the commission are entitled to the legislative per diem, as
 defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and
 reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to
 their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission.
 Public members not otherwise compensated by their

employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission and, upon a demonstration of financial hardship, a per diem equal to the legislative per diem for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That no later than December 1, 2003, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 121st Legislature. The commission is authorized to submit legislation related to its report for introduction to the Second Regular Session of the 121st Legislature at the time of submission of its report; and be it further

Sec. 9. Extension. Resolved: That, if the commission requires a limited extension of time to complete its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant an extension; and be it further

Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Councilor or the executive director's designee shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

This resolve establishes the Commission to Determine Why Young People Are Leaving Maine.
