8	3. Executive director. The board shall select an executive director to serve as staff to the Maine Rural Development
10	Council. The executive director is a nonvoting member of the board.

14	4. Executive officers. The board shall elect a chair, vice-chair and secretary from among its members. The chair or, in the chair's absence, the vice-chair shall preside over
16	meetings of the board. An executive officer may not serve more
18	than 2 consecutive terms.
20	5. Duties. The board shall:
22	A. Coordinate rural development policies, programs and activities among federal and state agencies, local and tribal governments, the private sector and nonprofit
24	economic development and social service organizations;
26	B. Provide advocacy on the social and economic needs and issues of rural Maine communities, particularly in the most
28	distressed counties of the State;
30	C. Coordinate the targeting of rural development resources to the most distressed counties;

46	6. Support of state agencies. The Governor shall encourage

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Sec. 3. Transition provisions. This Act allocates in statute 2 provisions recognizing the Maine Rural Development Council, which was initiated in 1991 by Executive Order 8, FY 91/92. It establishes the Maine Rural Development Board as the governing 4 body of the council and authorizes the board to participate in the National Rural Development Partnership. Members of the Maine б Rural Development Board and the executive director of the Maine Rural Development Council serving on the effective date of this 8 Act continue to serve. The Maine Rural Development Council must 10 continue to be governed in accordance with its bylaws adopted June 22, 2000 and subsequent amendment to those bylaws. 12 **SUMMARY** 14 16 This bill establishes the Maine Rural Development Council in
