It directs the Department of Human Services to adopt rules regarding 28 medical assessment for home health care services under Rule Chapter 101, the MaineCare Benefits Manual, Ch. II - Section 40. 30 The rules may move the initial assessment period from no less than 60 days to no more than 120 days. The resulting rule must 32 be cost neutral. The amendment requires a report by April 1, 2005. The amendment also changes the title.
