	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22	(2) The party has maintained enrollment of members equal to or greater than 0.5% of all registered voters in the State according to the most current tabulation
24	of registered voters performed by the Secretary of State.

28	SUMMARY
30	This bill allows a recognized political party to maintain its qualified status by either receiving 5% of the ballots cast
32	for Governor or President in either of the 2 preceding general elections or maintaining an enrollment of members equal to 0.5%
34	of all registered voters in the State.
