2	Sec. 1. 39-A MRSA §102, sub-§4, ¶C, as enacted by PL 1991, c
4	885, Pt. A, §8 and affected by §§9 to 11, is amended to read:
6	C. Notwithstanding paragraphs A and B, the average weekly wage of a seasonal worker is determined by dividing the
8	employee's total wages, earnings or salary for the priog calendar year by 52.
10	(1) For the purposes of this paragraph, the term
12	"seasonal worker" does not include any employee who is customarily employed, full time or part time, for more
14	than 26 weeks in a calendar year. The employee need not be employed by the same employer during this period
16	to fall within this exclusion.
