Amend the resolve in the emergency preamble by striking out 20 all of the 3rd and 4th paragraphs and inserting in their place the following:

'Whereas, Private and Special Law 2001, chapter 71
 authorized a general fund bond in the amount of \$7,000,000 to raise funds to construct and upgrade water pollution control
 facilities, to remove discharges and to make renovations and enhance wastewater treatment at the Department of Inland
 Fisheries and Wildlife's fish-rearing facilities; and

30 Whereas, authorization of this commission for an additional period is essential to allow the commission to provide 32 legislative policy guidance on the expenditures of those funds; and

Further amend the resolve by striking out all of section 2 36 and inserting in its place the following:

- 38 'Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 15 members:
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 The President of the Senate shall appoint 2 members of
 the Senate to the commission. The first Senator appointed pursuant to this subsection is the Senate chair of the
