Presented by Representative USHER of Westbrook. (GOVERNOR'S BILL) Cosponsored by Senator HATCH of Somerset and Representative: McKENNEY of Cumberland, Senator: SAVAGE of Knox. Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

8 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of state departments and institutions will become due 10 and payable prior to June 30, 2003; and

12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore,

18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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PART A

Sec. A-1. Supplemental allocations. There are allocated from various funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, to the departments listed, the following sums.

Sec. C-2. Lease-purchase authorized for Vans, buses and other transportation vehicles involved with public transit. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587, the Department of Transportation, Special Revenue Fund, is authorized to establish lease-purchase contracts for the procurement of vans, buses and other transportation vehicles. The term of the contracts may not be more than 8 years. The outstanding principal debt may not exceed \$1,000,000. The interest rate may not exceed 8% and outstanding debt for interest may not exceed \$240,000.

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PART D

Sec. D-1. PL 1997, c. 674, Pt. C, §§2 and 3, as amended by PL 1999, c. 737, Pt. E, §1, are further amended to read:

Sec. C-2. Amended lease-purchase authorized for engineering vehicles or equipment. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587, the Department of Transportation, Highway Fund, is authorized to establish lease-purchase contracts for the procurement of engineering vehicles or equipment. The term of the contracts may not be more than 7 years. The eumulative-total principal-value outstanding principal debt of the lease-purchase contracts may not exceed \$10,000,000. The interest rate may not 2 exceed 8% and the total <u>outstanding debt for</u> interest may not exceed \$2,400,000.

Sec. C-3. Amended lease-purchase authorized for vehicles or 6 equipment. Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587, the Department of Transportation, Motor Transport Service, is authorized to establish lease-purchase contracts for 8 the procurement of vehicles or equipment. The term of the contracts may not be more than 7 years. The eumulative-total 10 principal-value outstanding principal debt of the lease-purchase contracts may not exceed \$12,000,000. The interest rate may not 12 exceed 8% and total-interest-costs outstanding debt for interest may not exceed \$2,880,000. 14

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PART E

 18 Sec. E-1. Highway Fund Salary Plan; lapsed balances. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, \$4,000,000 in the
 20 Compensation and Benefit Plan, Highway Fund account in the Department of Administrative and Financial Services lapses to the
 22 unallocated balance of the Highway Fund in fiscal year 2002-03.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

30 This bill does the following.

32 Part A makes allocations of funds for fiscal year 2002-03.

34 Part B makes allocations of funds for approved reclassifications and range changes.

Part C authorizes the Department of Administrative and Financial Services on behalf of the Department of the Secretary of State to enter into financing arrangements for the acquisition of software and systems for a motor vehicle database and computer system to support the operations of the Department of the Secretary of State as approved in Public Law 2001, chapter 361, section 35.

It also authorizes the Department of Transportation to 46 establish lease-purchase contracts for the procurement of vans, buses and other transportation vehicles.

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Part D amends Public Law 1997, chapter 674, the authority 50 for lease-purchase for engineering vehicles or equipment and other vehicles and equipment for Motor Transportation Service.
