18	Amend the bill in section 1 by striking out all of subsection 5 and inserting in its place the following:

22	'5. Notification exemption. The following activities are exempt from the notification requirement under this section:
24	A. Activities where forest products are harvested for an owner's own use and are not sold or offered for sale or used
26	in the owner's primary wood-using plants;
28	B. Precommercial silvicultural forestry activities; and
30	C. Harvesting <u>performed by the landowner</u> within a 12-month period when the total area harvested on land owned by that
32	landowner does not exceed:
34	(1) Two acres if the residual basal area of acceptable growing stock over 4 1/2 inches in diameter measured at
36	4 1/2 feet above the ground is less than 30 square feet basal area per acre; or

40	(2) Five acres if the residual basal area of acceptable growing stock over 4 1/2 inches in diameter measured at 4 1/2 feet above the ground is more than 30
42	square feet basal area per acre.'

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2	SUMMARY
4	Current law exempts from harvest notification requirements harvesting when the total area harvested on land owned by the
6	landowner does not exceed either 2 or 5 acres, depending on the
Ü	residual basal area of acceptable growing stock. The bill
8	repealed this exemption. This amendment instead specifies that
	it is only harvesting performed by the landowner that qualifies
10	for this exemption.
