### §572. Person barred in another jurisdiction

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A person barred from competing in boxing, wrestling or kick-boxing contests or exhibitions by any state or federal body governing these contests or exhibitions is barred from competing in any such contest or exhibition in this State.

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#### SUMMARY

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This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Business, Research and Economic Development. The amendment strikes from the bill Part B, which eliminated state licensing of transient sellers. The amendment moves from the Maine Revised Statues, Title 32 to Title 17 the crime of promoting or participating in a professional or amateur "toughman," "badman" or "ultimate fighting" match. Title 17 includes a number of crimes and other similar prohibited conduct. The amendment also bars a person from boxing, wrestling or kick boxing in Maine if the person has been barred from competing in such events by any state or federal body.

This bill includes an Other Special Revenue Funds deallocation of \$2,778 in fiscal year 2004-05 for the Office of Licensing and Registration within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation as a result of the elimination of state licensing of boxers and wrestlers. This measure also reduces dedicated revenue for the Athletic Commission by \$21,000 beginning in fiscal year 2004-05.
